

In closing...

As I finish my second term as Treasurer, I am proud that I have refined our record-keeping and audit procedures, and provided clear documentation of these procedures along with our organization's legal and tax status for my successors. These procedures and documentation will help future officers see patterns and trends in our finances, and our new 501 (c)3 status with the IRS opens new opportunities such as free or reduced cost for services (e.g., Google Workspace) and eligibility for tax-deductible donations and grant funding. The future Council has more options for raising funds to fulfill its mission than ever. The Executive officers and Council have made careful choices to invest in our new website and shift our online platforms (GoogleWorkspace) to help us work more efficiently. We were able to do this through careful fiscal management. I plan to assist the incoming treasurer to ensure a smooth transition for developing the 2023-26 budget as well as for all our procedures and record-keeping, and will be available for any questions about the role as needed.

Accomplishments since July 2022

- Continuation of Music Instrument Drive in the form of ukulele kits with specially curated Ukrainian folksongs a collaboration between the World Federation of Music Therapy (WFMT) and with the Ukulele Kids Club (UKC) and the support of the International Choral Conductors' Federation (ICCF) and International Kodaly Symposium (IKS) (July 2022- January 2023). To date 250 ukuleles have been donated via the "Ukes for Ukraine" campaign.
- Advocacy for UKC and the ongoing "Ukes for Ukraine" campaign organized under University Putra Malaysia (UPM) led music therapy regional symposium, in collaboration with the WFMT, Malaysian Society for Music in Medicine (MSMM) and Malaysian Music Therapy Association (MMTA) (August 2022).
- Live interview of the Chair of GCIC by UKC to advocate for the use of ukuleles to provide music therapy comfort and support to refugees of the Ukraine War (October 2022).
- Donation from the Gibson Guitar Foundation to renew support for Ukraine refugee programs to UKC in conjunction with the "Ukes for Ukraine" campaign (Feb 2023).
- WFMT Care Teams (pilot testing to assess regional cooperation within SE Asia region via "Moving Music Therapy Forward 2022" (Aug 12&13, 2023 in UPM). Symposium to help coordinate and enlist groups of volunteers in 5 countries across SE Asia: Malaysia (including the Malaysian Music Therapy Association), Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines, India, to determine challenges salient to the region and coordinate efforts to mobilize cooperation and support that can be rapidly mobilized in times of crisis (including support to neighboring countries such as Myanmar under military oppression, as well as other WFMT related advocacy activities who are members of the WFMT membership;
- UNDP training on "Impact Measurement" for WFMT Care Teams project from June 2022 March 2023 with generation of Impact Measurement and Management Workbook for future applications into impact measurement of WFMT Care Teams projects across 8 regions (beyond the initial SE Asian region).

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- TedTALK on "The Power of Music to Connect People" (How music builds bridges of connection and lifelines of support during times of crises) to advocate for the music therapy in crises intervention work of the World Federation of Music Therapy (Nov 2022).

Ongoing activities

- Continuation of Impact Measurement & Management Approach (IMMA) translation into WFMT Care Teams
 overview. Identification and mapping out of basic activities produce positive impact, more programs, with
 more activities and more teams being added systematically to increase positive impact.
- Streamlining and selection of elements measured in WFMT Care Teams projects through IMMA to include how many people have received positive impact (the number of positive impacts, look at how depth not just numbers), measurement of well-being (based on what is considered desirable for specific population and crisis need including any changes in behaviour e.g., increased knowledge, more awareness; or increased quality of life e.g., reduction of anxiety or stress);

- Telehealth training and support to music therapists inside serving internally displaced children under political oppression inside Myanmar; (November 2022 ongoing).
- measurement of IMPACT CHANGE from time to time by looking for short-term change leading to mediumterm change and long-term change by asking 3 types of questions from the volunteers who are committed.
- Preparation for WCMT 2023 Spotlight Session on DEI highlighting Cultural Diplomacy initiative during precrisis stage, to encourage cultural exchange of ideas, values, traditions and other aspects of culture or identity in order to strengthen relationships, enhance socio-cultural cooperation, promote mutual interests in laying groundwork for WFMT Care Teams;

Future projects during this term

 Soft launch and then full launch of WFMT Care Teams (initial testing and mobilization in SE Asia region to be expanded to other regions) to help train groups of volunteers in each country who are trained in *trauma informed care/psychological first aid and advocacy, and can be rapidly mobilized in times of crisis as well as for other WFMT related advocacy activities who are members of the WFMT membership;

In closing...

It is my sincere hope that the WFMT Care Teams initiative spearheaded by the GCIC will be able to create a proactive and positive response to crisis at all levels and stages around the world to prevent escalation of situations and in the process ease the trauma and suffering of populations who are affected, including music therapists. Adopting a coordinated and proactive approach to crisis intervention, training volunteer teams to be on standby in preparation for trauma-informed work, offering opportunities to train in psychological first aid and conduct music therapy advocacy work, as well as activities to nurture music therapists self-care in order to waylay and prevent burnout is the GCIC's attempt to provide long term sustainability and care to music therapists around the world, who give sincerely and sacrificially in our caring profession.

- In 2023 the WMTW was introduced and the PR commission managed posts on all social media platforms. The week saw high levels of engagement from the international music therapy community - from individual music therapists, associations, training institutions, and journals.
- Supported council members, regional liaisons, and full-member organizations in disseminating news on social media. This particularly applied to advertising conferences and webinars, supporting the Global Crises Commission during various calls for support such as the Ukrainian Crisis and the Tūrkiye earthquake disaster, and assisting the Certification and Education Commission with uploading the respective videos that were produced from across the regions.
- The promotion for WCMT2023, in particular, working closely with the organizing committee of the congress. Weekly and, at times, bi-weekly posts have been shared on all social media sites.
- A template for organizational members was created, and two were posted. Unfortunately, this project was not successfully completed due to the limited capacity of commission members.
- Assisting with the formatting and updating of documents such as the Job Description and Slate of Candidates' documents respectively

- 4. Brought in faculty from Malaysia to be part of the board of studies at the School of Music Therapy in India to provide expertise on medical music therapy curriculum.
- 5. Interdisciplinary research work taking place with Malaysian faculty.
- 6. Students of music therapy in India organized a panel discussion along with the ASD of WFMT as part of World Music Therapy Celebrations.
- A book chapter on colonialism with south Asian Music therapists from south Asia and those in other parts of the globe was published in the 4th quarter of 2022.
- 8. Connected with a music therapist from Myanmar.
- 9. Part of a program designed by UPH as a resource person.

Ongoing Activities

- 1. Process of completing an MOU with UPM
- 2. Maintaining relationships and communicating with regional music therapists of South East Asia/South Asia
- 3. Creating opportunities for the music therapists and others to find a space to discuss music therapy activities in their regions.
- 4. Connected with institutes across the country with the prospects of bridging various music therapy bases together, as education and training centers as well as in community related therapy settings.
- 5. Working together with Southeast Asian Music Therapists along with music therapists from across the globe to create more projects that will support and improve the state of music therapy in many regions of south east Asia.
- Working along with South Asian Music Therapists and students trained in this region and from other countries. The need to understand the needs of south Asians differs from southeast Asian needs



Future projects during this term – are still in process

- a. Bring forward the work done to connect students from southeast Asian countries together to bridge the gap of knowledge.
- b. To continue supporting music therapist in the region
- c. To forge towards the creation of an association in India
- d. Try and create a strategic plan to connect to more regions within south East Asia.
- e. To continue to connect and work towards bringing together music therapists within the region and extend support towards music therapy education, training, practice and research.
- f. Creating a space/forum for south Asians to trained and practicing in india as well as those trained and practicing in other countries

This term from 2020 -2023 has been quite accomplishing. Having taken part in the process of changing world music therapy day to world music therapy week was quite an eye opener. It provided me the sensitivity and empathy toward the thoughts and needs of global perspectives.
